Learning Outcomes:

For Grades 3-8 the focus will be on a variety of sports and unique set of sports, fitness, and games/activities. Such sports may include, but are not limited to football, soccer, basketball, tennis, golf, lacrosse, kickball, softball, and baseball. Fitness is also a very important aspect of this class, students will learn a variety of stretches, exercises, and locomotor movements to improve on overall fitness. Students will be assessed on participation, personal conduct, and skill sets for each unit.

For Grades K-2 the focus will be on fine and gross motor skills. This will be through the use of a variety of games that key in on those motor skills. Fine motor skills may include, but are not limited to catching and hand-eye-coordination. Gross motor skills include walking, running, skipping, throwing, galloping, and others too. Students will be graded on participation, personal conduct, and skill sets for each unit or activity.

Grading 3-8

Each day during class students will be graded on a five point scale

Grade	Reason for Grade
0	Unprepared for class or is a completed distraction to the class due to extreme behavioral issues.
1	Prepared for class with proper attire, but does not participate.
2	Prepared and only participates in warm-up activities.
3	Prepared and participates in warm-up activity and participates minimally in game play or activities.
4	Prepared and participates in class with a satisfactory effort
5	Prepared and participates in class showing an extreme understanding of game play and shows maximum effort

Grading K-2

Grade	Reason for Grade
4	Shows an extreme knowledge of the particular physical skill and exceeds the level of grade level expectations during the game play with ease. Can demonstrate skills at physical levels that surpass their grade level and developmental abilities.
3	Fully shows an understanding of the particular skill during game play and can demonstrate the skills at their grade level and developmental ability every time.
2	Can partially show an understanding of the particular skill during game play and can demonstrate the skills at their grade level and developmental ability most of the time.
1	Does not show understanding of the particular skill during game play and cannot demonstrate the skills at their grade level and developmental ability.

*Students in Kindergarten through fourth grade will also receive an E (excellent), S (Satisfactory), N (Not satisfactory) or N/A (does not apply) for Physical Education standards that deal in personal responsibility, conduct, cooperation, and teamwork during game play as well as their normal grade
