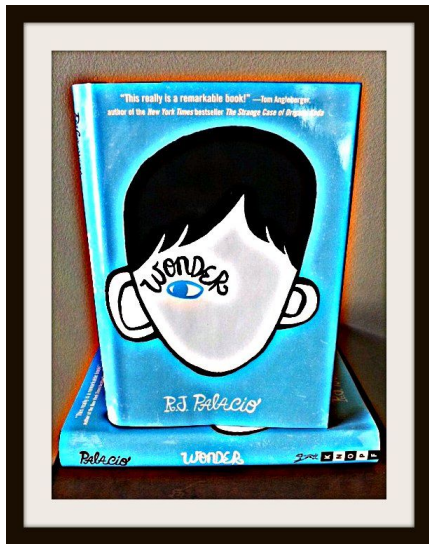


# Middle School Summer Reading
